Cayucos Veteran's Hall: A New Beginning

The rehabilitation of the Cayucos Veteran's Hall has been underway since December 2022. This historic building holds special significance to the community of Cayucos, and its reopening will signal a new phase for the public gathering place, which has been closed since 2016.

The Cayucos Veteran's Hall was originally built by James Cass in 1875 to serve as a warehouse for his shipping business. In addition to containing a post office and general store, the warehouse was used to keep harvested goods and dairy products safe while awaiting shipment to larger markets. Neighboring farmers would congregate at the Cass Warehouse the day before ships arrived, an ad hoc social gathering that came to be known as "Butter Day." During the height of the shipping industry in Cayucos during the 1880s, up to 125 wagons traveled to Cass's warehouse on Butter Day.

Cass died in 1917 and his beachfront property was sold to the Paso Robles Beach Company in 1923. By this time, road and railway infrastructure had improved, and maritime shipping was being replaced by overland transport. Cass's wharf, which once provided an essential link to larger markets, was increasingly used as a fishing pier and a sightseeing location. The warehouse was moved from the starting point of the pier to its current location on the beachfront, adjacent to the pier. The buildings changed hands multiple times before the State of California became the owner of the pier, beach, and warehouse in 1940. In 1956 the warehouse was renamed the Cayucos Veteran's Memorial Hall and continued to be used as a gathering place for the local community until its closure in 2016.

The current rehabilitation effort will strip away some of the modern features of the building that were added during the mid-twentieth century, including the drop-down ceiling and exterior stucco. The rehabilitation will expose the original wood siding and ceiling trusses. A new foundation will elevate the warehouse to prepare for sea level rise, ensuring its safety and accessibility for generations to come.

This project will re-introduce the Cayucos Veteran's Hall to the community as a gathering place, a role it has filled since the lifetime of James Cass: in 1877, the San Luis Obispo Weekly Tribune noted the use of Cass's warehouse as a ballroom in celebration of the anniversary of the Independence of Switzerland, an event celebrated by the large Swiss-Italian immigrant community of the area. Cass's warehouse has always been used as a gathering place by the local community, and this project will return this special space to its original purpose and appearance.
